


- 1. Dr. Sunita Srivastava, Dean Management, welcomed Chairman Sir, Dr. Harishchandra Mishra ji, Founder Trustee, Shri Ashish Mishra ji, Member and Trustee, Shri Aditya Mishra ji, Member & Trustee, Ar. Gurunath Dalvi ji, Former-Principal, Director of L.S. Raheja College of Architecture, Former- Vice President of COA, Well known Architect, Ar. Sukumar Dharmadhikari ji, Practicing Architect, Eminent Architect, Businessman, Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji, Founder Crescentia Strategists Inc., Ar. Rajiv Mishra ji, Educationist, Well known Architect, Principal, JJ School of Architecture, Director, Directorate of Art, Maharashtra Ar. Sarita Deshpande, Principal, ACA.
- 2. As per the first point of the agenda, Dr. Sunita Srivastava invited CA Vinay Tiwari, Assistant Professor, ASBM for the budget presentation for A.Y. 2023 - 24. CA Vinay Tiwari started by presenting the budgeted versus actual expenses for A.Y. 2022-23. He then presented the budgets for A.Y. 2023-24 for both AIMSR and ASBM in detail. On account of an error pointed by Shri Ashish Mishra ji in the AIMSR budget 2023 -24 related to MCA fees, Chairman Sir, Dr. Harishchandra Mishra ji asked CA Vinay Tiwari to review and revise the budgets of AIMSR and ASBM.

Regarding the deficit shown in both the budgets, Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji wanted to know the plan for how the deficit will be funded in future. He suggested conducting corporate training programs for company executives through the inhouse HR Faculty. These programs could be behavioral, functional or excel training to earn revenue to offset the deficit mentioned in the budget. He suggested that what the Institute does beyond the

gular teaching will be a differentiator for the Institute. He also stated that students need to undertake live project from the industry because classroom education alone cannot build

Dr. Srivastava presented the achievements and activities of both AIMSR & ASBM for the A.Y. 2022-23. The presentation began by mentioning that the AQAR for NAAC cycle 2 was due for submission latest by 31st May 2023. For this Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji asked about the ways in which the NAAC B+ grade can be improved to grade A. Dr. Sunita stated that progress in respective criteria is being made. She shared that both AIMSR & ASBM are now ISO 21001:2018 accredited. Shri Ashish Mishra ji added that these ISO certificates are given particularly for education institutions by following Educational Organizations Management System (EOMS) guidelines.

She then shared the activities organized by various clubs including Marketing, Finance, and Operations. The most recent event, 10th Innovation & E-summit was organized with the enthusiasm and excitement. The highlights included 2 panel discussions and BORIVALL of Principals of Degree colleges. She added that during the NAAC visit it was asked by the panel members to increase the Social Sensitization ACTIVITE OF MANAGEMENT ADITYA INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT and social percentage activities



last year like Kargil Vijay Diwas, National Sports Day. Social extension activities included teaching under privileged students, blood donation camp etc. World No Tobacco Day etc. are a few to name. She talked about the regular interaction with the alumni through various programs such as Alumni Coffee Meets and Alumni Mentoring programs. Madam also highlighted that the Institute has 1273 alumni connected through the Alumni Portal. Her presentation also included celebrations on the campus such as Swaraj Diwas, Aditya Youth Conclave, Teacher's Day, Independence and republics days are a few to mention. Dean Madam highlighted the academic collaborations with the various foreign universities including Lincoln University, USA, SSM, Switzerland, ENAE Business School, Spain, Paragon International University, Cambodia, SALT & University of Economics, Bulgaria. She mentioned the latest MOU signed with Leader's Institute, Australia. Her presentation also covered the live projects done by the students in companies like snack Amor, Visol, Ola, TOI etc; summer internships and placement details during 2022-23. Dean Madam presented the contents and results obtained by the students in various certification programs such as NISM & Cambridge English. Madam shared that Aditya Centre of Excellence has partnered with NSDC to promote various courses such as Mutual Funds, Digital Marketing, Social Media Marketing, HR Payroll etc. As a part of design and development of the curriculum for ADBM, Academic Advisory Committee (AAC) meetings were held for all the specializations. The feedback received was incorporated in the syllabus accordingly. Madam also informed the members about the three LIC visits conducted by the University of Mumbai for Ph.D Centre, BMS and MCA.

- 4. Roadmap for the AY 2023-24: As part of the road map for the Institutions, Dean Madam shared the Strategic Plan for 2023-24 by defining the main Goal as Going Global. She highlighted that in the year 2023-24, both the Institutions would focus on the following five pillars of performance:
 - a. Admissions b. Placements c. Intellectual capital d. Industry-Institute Interface
 - e. Infrastructure

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5. Valuable Suggestions in conclusion: Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji congratulated Dr. Sunita Madam for the events and activities undertaken by the Institutes and also for achieving the ISO 21001:2018 Certificates. Sir asked how the Institute is monetizing the relationships with the foreign Universities with which MOUs are signed. Dean Madam informed that a physical exchange had not yet happened in terms of Faculty or student exchange, but international webinars were conducted with speakers from the international universities including SSM Switzerland, ENAE Business School Spain and Leader's Institute Australia. Also, research papers were obtained from themfor the International Research Conference. Also, students from Australia participated online in the Aditya Youth Conclave contest. Shri Dharmadhikari ji suggested making a prerequisite qualification mandatory for admissions to ASBM. He suggested to fix up a threshold and if the threshold is not crossed, admission should not be provided. Sir inquired about the placement details – percentage of students placed, average salary and maximum package. Sir also suggested that there should be some other sources of generating the revenue. Visiting faculty can be incentivized if they support in generating the revenues (by conducting MDP or giving live projects to the students etc.)

Chairman Sir advised that the frequency of Governing Council meetings should be fixed as three/six months. Trustee Shri Ashish Mishra ji advised to apply for NBA accreditation by September, 2023.

Dr. Sunita Srivastava, Dean Management, welcomed Chairman Sir, Dr. Harishchandra Mishra ji, Founder Trustee, Shri Ashish Mishra ji, Member and Trustee, Shri Aditya Mishra ji, Member & Trustee, Ar. Gurunath Dalvi ji, Former-Principal, Director of L.S. Raheja College of Architecture, Former- Vice President of COA, Well known Architect, Ar. Sukumar Dharmadhikari ji, Practicing Architect, Eminent Architect, Businessman, Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji, Founder Crescentia Strategists Inc., Ar. Rajiv Mishra ji, Educationist, Well known Architect, Principal, JJ School of Architecture, Director, Directorate of Art, Maharashtra Ar. Sarita Deshpande, Principal, ACA.
- 2. As per the first point of the agenda, Dr. Sunita Srivastava invited CA Vinay Tiwari, Assistant Professor, ASBM for the budget presentation for A.Y. 2023 - 24. CA Vinay Tiwari started by presenting the budgeted versus actual expenses for A.Y. 2022-23. He then presented the budgets for A.Y. 2023-24 for both AIMSR and ASBM in detail. On account of an error pointed by Shri Ashish Mishra ji in the AIMSR budget 2023 -24 related to MCA fees, Chairman Sir, Dr. Harishchandra Mishra ji asked CA Vinay Tiwari to review and revise the budgets of AIMSR and ASBM.

Regarding the deficit shown in both the budgets, Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji wanted to know the plan for how the deficit will be funded in future. He suggested conducting corporate training programs for company executives through the inhouse HR Faculty. These programs could be behavioral, functional or excel training to earn revenue to offset the deficit mentioned in the budget. He suggested that what the Institute does beyond the

Dr. Srivastava presented the achievements and activities of both AIMSR & ASBM for the A.Y. 2022-23. The presentation began by mentioning that the AQAR for NAAC cycle 2 was due for submission latest by 31st May 2023. For this Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji asked about the ways in which the NAAC B+ grade can be improved to grade A. Dr. Sunita stated that progress in respective criteria is being made. She shared that both AIMSR & ASBM are now ISO 21001:2018 accredited. Shri Ashish Mishra ji added that these ISO certificates are given particularly for education institutions by following Educational Organizations Management System (EOMS) guidelines.

She then shared the activities organized by various clubs including Marketing, Finance, and Operations. The most recent event, 10th Innovation & E-summit was organized with the enthusiasm and excitement. The highlights included 2 panel discussions and BORIVALL of Principals of Degree colleges. She added that during the NAAC visit it was asked by the panel members to increase the Social Sensitization ACTIVITE OF MANAGEMENT ADITYA INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT and social percentage activities



last year like Kargil Vijay Diwas, National Sports Day. Social extension activities included teaching under privileged students, blood donation camp etc. World No Tobacco Day etc. are a few to name. She talked about the regular interaction with the alumni through various programs such as Alumni Coffee Meets and Alumni Mentoring programs. Madam also highlighted that the Institute has 1273 alumni connected through the Alumni Portal. Her presentation also included celebrations on the campus such as Swaraj Diwas, Aditya Youth Conclave, Teacher's Day, Independence and republics days are a few to mention. Dean Madam highlighted the academic collaborations with the various foreign universities including Lincoln University, USA, SSM, Switzerland, ENAE Business School, Spain, Paragon International University, Cambodia, SALT & University of Economics, Bulgaria. She mentioned the latest MOU signed with Leader's Institute, Australia. Her presentation also covered the live projects done by the students in companies like snack Amor, Visol, Ola, TOI etc; summer internships and placement details during 2022-23. Dean Madam presented the contents and results obtained by the students in various certification programs such as NISM & Cambridge English. Madam shared that Aditya Centre of Excellence has partnered with NSDC to promote various courses such as Mutual Funds, Digital Marketing, Social Media Marketing, HR Payroll etc. As a part of design and development of the curriculum for ADBM, Academic Advisory Committee (AAC) meetings were held for all the specializations. The feedback received was incorporated in the syllabus accordingly. Madam also informed the members about the three LIC visits conducted by the University of Mumbai for Ph.D Centre, BMS and MCA.

- 4. Roadmap for the AY 2023-24: As part of the road map for the Institutions, Dean Madam shared the Strategic Plan for 2023-24 by defining the main Goal as Going Global. She highlighted that in the year 2023-24, both the Institutions would focus on the following five pillars of performance:
 - a. Admissions b. Placements c. Intellectual capital d. Industry-Institute Interface
 - e. Infrastructure

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5. Valuable Suggestions in conclusion: Shri P. Chandrashekhar ji congratulated Dr. Sunita Madam for the events and activities undertaken by the Institutes and also for achieving the ISO 21001:2018 Certificates. Sir asked how the Institute is monetizing the relationships with the foreign Universities with which MOUs are signed. Dean Madam informed that a physical exchange had not yet happened in terms of Faculty or student exchange, but international webinars were conducted with speakers from the international universities including SSM Switzerland, ENAE Business School Spain and Leader's Institute Australia. Also, research papers were obtained from themfor the International Research Conference. Also, students from Australia participated online in the Aditya Youth Conclave contest. Shri Dharmadhikari ji suggested making a prerequisite qualification mandatory for admissions to ASBM. He suggested to fix up a threshold and if the threshold is not crossed, admission should not be provided. Sir inquired about the placement details – percentage of students placed, average salary and maximum package. Sir also suggested that there should be some other sources of generating the revenue. Visiting faculty can be incentivized if they support in generating the revenues (by conducting MDP or giving live projects to the students etc.)

Chairman Sir advised that the frequency of Governing Council meetings should be fixed as three/six months. Trustee Shri Ashish Mishra ji advised to apply for NBA accreditation by September, 2023.
